MP Employees' Unions divided over UPS

Maharashtra becomes first state in country to implement UPS, MP may follow suit

The Modi government's announcement of the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS) for Central government employees has caused a split among employees' Unions in Madhya Pradesh with some welcoming it, while others rejecting it terming it 'eyewash'.

Hailing the Central government's move, a few employees' organisations want the Madhya Pradesh government to roll out the UPS in the state, however, there are a few outfits which, sticking to their old demand, want the state to implement the Old Pension Scheme (OPS).

Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir and Delhi, said one of the members of an employees' organisation. BJP ruled states including Madhya Pradesh are likely to roll UPS for its employees in near future, he added.

The State secretary, Class Three Employees Association Umashankar Tiwari talking to Free Press said that after the Central government announcement of UPS, neighbouring election-bound Maharashtra has become the first state to offer its employees UPS and sooner or later, Madhya Pradesh will follow suit.

However, terming the decision erroneous, Tiwari questioned the government for launching UPS. "When OPS is our demand then why is it not being implemented. The demand of the entire country is OPS," said Tiwari.

UPS has lessened the problems but not completely erased them, he added. Madhya Pradesh Forest Employee Association's vice president Nirmal Tiwari echoing the same views said that the government had failed to do justice



What is UPS

The UPS, which kicks in from the next fiscal year, assures a pension of 50% of the basic salary for those who joined the service after January 1, 2004. Those with a minimum of 10 years of service will receive a pension of at least Rs 10,000 per month on superannuation and an assured family pension in case of demise of the pensioner.

with the employees. "Wherever the Assembly elections are held, government employees have voted against BJP. That's why Centre came up with UPS in wake of Assembly elections

to iron out the issues. However, employees' demand for the Old Pension Scheme as UPS is mere eyewash," he said.

Speaking on the matter, MP Stenographer Association president Subash Verma said that though employees are demanding OPS, there are certain good things for the employees in the UPS and hence should be immediately implemented in the state.

Madhya Pradesh Rajya Karamchhari Manch's State President Ashok Pandey also welcomed the scheme saying that UPS should be rolled out in MP immediately. "The only lacuna is that it is linked to the share market. The employees are not being benefited from NPS. At least UPS has something to offer," said Pandey.

Madhya Pradesh Rajya Karamchhari Sangh in a meeting on Saturday demanded immediate implementation of UPS in the state. The Sangh general secretary Jitendra Singh said that UPS the organization has decided to launch a movement after September 10 for implementation of UPS in the state.

Union min inspects SSH, calls for equipment upgrade

Minister of State (independent charge) AYUSH and Health and Family Welfare, Pratap Rao Jadhav, was on inspection visit at the Super Speciality Hospital (SSH), on Monday. During his visit, he reviewed the hospital's facilities and discussed the need for upgrades with hospital staff. Dr Sumit Shukla, superintendent of the hospital, emphasised the necessity for modern equipment. He pointed out that equipment worth Rs 20 crore, approved in 2018, is now outdated.

'About 90 per cent of the approved equipment has been delivered, enabling surgeries for complex diseases. However, 10 per cent has yet to arrive and there's a pressing need to replace the old equipment with updated versions

for better convenience to both doctors and patients,' Dr Shukla stated. Additionally, Dr Sanjay Dixit, Dean MGM Medical College urged the minister to expedite the approval for a 100-bed trauma centre. He noted that the proposal, initially raised following a visit by deputy Chief Minister Rajendra Shukla, is pending for approval in Delhi. A separate proposal for a 50-bed

trauma centre at Chacha Nehru Hospital was also submitted. During the inspection, Minister Jadhav toured various units of the hospital, including the bone marrow unit, catheter lab unit, central sterile supply department and the cardiac unit. The minister assured that the government is committed to enhance health services and increase public trust in AYUSH treatments.

DHEW facilitates employment for local woman

The District Hub of Empowerment of Women (DHEW), in collaboration with Vimal Social Service Institute, a non-governmental organisation, has facilitated employment for a local woman by providing her with a food stall, complete with a cart and all essential amenities to start her business.

Maya Solanki, a resident of Prajapati Nagar, along with her husband, previously worked as small-scale caterers at various events. However, their work was irregular and they could only secure about 10-15 days of work each month, which was insufficient to meet their basic needs. For the past two months, they had been actively searching for



stable employment.

Meanwhile, Maya Solanki met Yogita Patil, a para-volunteer with the District Hub and the president of Vimal Social Service Institute. After learning about Maya's situation and her urgent need for work, Yogita Patil made arrangements for Maya to receive training to improve her cooking skills. Additionally, Maya received basic education over

the past three months as she had never attended school.

Vanchana Singh Parihar, the mission coordinator of the District Hub of Empowerment of Women in Indore, stated, 'We collaborate with NGOs and engage them as para-volunteers to empower women. As part of this initiative, a food stall was set up for Maya, complete with a cart and other necessary items. In addition to establishing the stall, we also helped her obtain essential documents such as a Sambal Card, Aadhaar Card, Voter ID, Samagra ID and provided her with an Ujjwala connection. Recognising the potential of Maya and her husband, Yogita Patil, along with Jagdish Patil, collaborated to purchase the cart and assist them in securing orders for snack items.

Youth found murdered in forest

Bhopal: A 22-year-old man was found dead with several wounds in a forest near the regional transport office in Bilkhiriya, the police said. The police reached the spot with forensic team. His death occurred 24 hours ago. The police said that they found a severe wound on his forehead, back and chest.
