Nepal prez holds meet on Hindu Kush

Nepal President Ramchandra Paudel on Monday called for regional cooperation to address the crisis of climate change, biodiversity loss, and air pollution in the Hindu Kush Himalaya region. Inaugurating the two-day Hindu Kush Himalaya Parliamentarians' Meet here, Paudel said, "This conference is the beginning of a roadmap for the present and a commitment for the future." The high-level regional gathering brought together around 200 delegates, including parliamentarians, policymakers, environmental scientists, climate experts, and media from the Hindu Kush Himalaya (HKH) region.

Myanmar to hold elections on Dec 28

Myanmar's military-appointed election commission announced on Monday that elections will begin on December 28, setting a date for polls that critics have denounced as a sham intended to normalise the army's 2021 seizure of power even as armed conflict rages throughout much of the country. The Union Election Commission said the elections will be conducted in phases over several days and that a full schedule will be released soon.

Boat capsizes in Nigeria; 10 rescued, 40 missing

At least 40 people are missing after a boat capsized on Sunday on a river in northwestern Nigeria, authorities said. The accident happened around the Goronyo area in Sokoto state while the boat was transporting passengers to a market, Nigeria's National Emergency Management Agency said in a statement late Sunday. The emergency agency said only 10 people have been rescued as teams continue search and rescue efforts in the area. The accident is the latest in a series of deadly boat mishaps on Nigerian waterways. Such

HOSTILE TURF | Ukraine slams Russian attack before Trump meet 'cynical'

Ready to work for peace: Zelenskyy

Ukraine's future could hinge on a hastily assembled meeting on Monday at the White House as President Volodymyr Zelenskyy presides over an extraordinary group of European leaders to show US President Donald Trump a united front against Russia.

The European leaders were left out of Trump's summit with Russian President Vladimir Putin last Friday, and they want to safeguard Ukraine and the continent from any widening aggression from Moscow. Many are coming with the explicit

goal of protecting Ukraine's interests – a rare and sweeping show of diplomatic force.

By coming as a group, they hope to avoid debates like Zelenskyy's February meeting in the Oval Office, where Trump chastised him for not showing enough gratitude for US military aid. Trump and Zelenskyy were due to meet in the Oval Office before European leaders join them in the East Room for talks.

The night before the meeting, however, Trump seemed to put the onus on Zelenskyy to agree to concessions and suggested that Ukraine could not

regain Crimea, which Russia annexed in 2014, setting off an armed conflict that led to its broader 2022 invasion.

"President Zelenskyy of Ukraine can end the war with Russia almost immediately, if he wants to, or he can continue to fight," Trump wrote Sunday night on social media. "Remember how it started. No getting back Obama given Crimea (12 years ago, without a shot being fired), and NO GOING INTO NATO BY UKRAINE. Some things never change!" Zelenskyy appeared to respond with his own post late Sunday, saying, "We all share a strong desire to end this war quickly and reliably."

CRIMEA IS KEY

As Trump asked Ukraine to give up on reclaiming Crimea, here's a look at its importance



- Crimea's unique location makes it strategically significant. Khrushchev transferred Crimea from Soviet Union to Ukraine in 1954.

- But Russia's Black Sea fleet continued to have a base in the city of Sevastopol.

- Russia annexed it on March 18, 2014 after a popular uprising forced the ouster of Ukraine's pro-Moscow president.

- Ahead of the Ukraine war, Russia deployed troops and weapons to Crimea.

- Securing a land corridor from Russia to Crimea by holding the occupied parts of Ukraine's Donetsk, Luhansk, Zaporizhzhia and Kherson regions was among Kremlin's key goals.

- Crimea soon became a battleground, with Ukraine trying to dislodge Moscow's hold.

- At Alaska summit, Putin listed Ukraine's recognition of Crimea as part of Russia among Moscow's peace riders.

Pakistan monsoon toll touches 657

At least 657 people died and nearly 1,000 were injured since late June in rain-related incidents in Pakistan, according to officials. In a media briefing on Sunday, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) Spokesperson Tayyab Shah said that heavy monsoon rains are expected to persist until August 22. He warned that two to three more monsoon spells are expected to hit the country in September. Shah noted that this year, monsoon rainfall had been 50 to 60 per cent heavier than last year.

This year's monsoon season ranks among the most destructive in recent memory, he said. According to NDMA, 657 people – 171 children, 94 women, and 392 men – died and 929 others were injured in rain-related

incidents across Pakistan since June 26. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is the worst-hit province with 390 deaths – 288 men, 59 children, and 43 women. In Punjab, 164 people – 70 children, 63 men, and 31 women – died in rain-related incidents since June 26. While Sindh recorded 28 deaths, including 14 children

and 4 women; in Balochistan, 20 people, including 11 children, died.

At least 32 people, including eight children, died in Gilgit-Baltistan, while 15 people, including five minors, were killed as heavy rains lashed Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Eight people, including 4 children, died in Islamabad.

Pak reports two new polio cases

Pakistan has reported two new poliovirus cases, taking the tally of the crippling disease to 21 this year, as per a media report on Monday. Pakistan and Afghanistan are the only countries in the world where polio remains endemic, according to WHO.

The fresh cases were reported in the Kohistan Lower district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province and the Badin district of Sindh province. Geo News reported. The victim from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is a six-year-old girl, while a 21-month-old girl was infected by the disease in Sindh.

Baloch lecturer held for planning attack

Security forces in southwestern Pakistan arrested a university lecturer accused of planning a foiled suicide attack that would have targeted last week's Independence Day celebrations in insurgency-hit Balochistan province, officials said on Monday.

The suspect, Usman Qazi, is claimed to have links with the outlawed Majeed Brigade, the suicide squad of the Balochistan Liberation Army, according to the province's Chief Minister, Sarfraz Bugti.

During a press conference in the city of Quetta, Bugti showed video footage of Qazi admitting to planning the thwarted attack as well as aiding militants in recent years. It was unclear whether Qazi made those remarks under

Plan to disarm Hezbollah: US to talk to Israel

The US special envoy to Lebanon said on Monday that his team would discuss the long-term cessation of hostilities with Israel, after Beirut endorsed a US-backed plan for the Hezbollah militant group to disarm.

Tom Barrack, following a meeting with Lebanese Prime Minister Joseph Aoun, also said Washington would seek an economic proposal for post-war reconstruction in the country, after months of shuttle diplomacy between the US and Lebanon.

Barrack is also set to meet with Prime Minister Nawaf Salam and Speaker Nabih Berri, who often ne-

gociates on behalf of Hezbollah with Washington.

"I think the Lebanese government has done their part. They've taken the first step," said Barrack, who is also the US ambassador to Turkey. "Now what we need is for Israel to comply with that equal handshake."

Lebanon's decision last week to support a plan to disarm Hezbollah angered the Iran-backed group and its allies, who believe Israel's military should first withdraw from the five hillsides it has occupied in southern Lebanon since the end of its 14-month war with Hezbollah last November and stop launching almost daily airstrikes in the country.

Qantas fined \$59m for Covid layoffs

A judge on Monday fined Qantas Airways 50 million Australian dollars (USD 38 million) for illegally firing more than 1,800 ground staff at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The penalty is in addition to the AUD 120 million (USD 78 million) in compensation that Australia's biggest airline had already agreed to pay its former employees.

Australian Federal Court Justice Michael Lee said the presiding of 1,800 ground staff and cleaner jobs at Australian airports in late 2020 was the "largest and most significant contravention" of relevant Australian labour laws in their 120-year history.

Swath stirs storm with model's slanted-eye ad

Swiss watchmaker Swatch is in the eye of a storm, quite literally. The luxury watchmaker was forced to apologise and take down an advertisement that featured an Asian model pulling the corners of his eyes, after the image

sparked backlash among Chinese social media users. The Chinese saw it as racist.

The gesture in the Swatch ad was criticised as offensive, with many pointing out that the "slanted eye" stereotype has historically been used to mock Asians, particularly people of Mongoloid origins.

On August 16, the company

said it "sincerely apologize[d] for any distress or misunderstanding this may have caused" and confirmed that it had removed all related advertising worldwide.

Despite the apology, many critics remained dissatisfied, accusing the brand of being motivated only by financial concerns.

End to Left control in Bolivia after 20 years, vote heads to runoff

Bolivia's presidential vote headed to an unprecedented runoff after a vote on Sunday that ended more than two decades of left-wing dominance in the Andean nation but signalled voters' repudiation about a major lurch to the right.

A dark horse centrist, Sen. Rodrigo Paz, drew more votes than the right-wing front-runners, although not enough to secure an outright victory, early results showed.

Paz, a former mayor who has sought to soften the edges
